About Promise Place

Promise Place was conceived in the hearts of three women who began entering the Dauphin County Prison to conduct weekly ministries of hope, faith and love with the women prisoners. From that mission Promise Place has grown to meet the needs of paroled women who have no home, no job and little or no help with their children and families.

In October 1997, the PROGRAM for Female Offenders, Inc. assumed responsibility for operating Promise Place and implementing programming for women in need.



Women released from prison have an opportunity to reside in a safe and supportive environment and received various programming, all geared in preparing them for a second chance at re-building their lives. Promise Place offers the residents structure and teaches responsibility for reintegration back into society as productive members of the community. Promise Place residents are assisted with GED preparation, job readiness, job search and referrals to other community provides for special needs including drug and alcohol treatment. In addition residents also participate in Community Service and positive group activities.

The minimum stay at Promise Place is six months and the maximum stay is one year. During the time each resident is required to maintain employment and a savings account. Before the resident prepares to leave Promise Place, they must secure safe, affordable and reliability in their daily lives and activities.
